# Development Aid from People to People in Zambia (DAPP)

Stop B Partnership

Project Location: Kabwe and Mkushi in Zambia

Timelines: May 2023 – May 2024 Aim:

> To model a rights-based and people-centered approach to TB service delivery in a prison setting that is monitored by prisoners in Zambia.

- To implement a model TB programme in the targeted prisons with monitoring led by prison inmates over 12 months.
- To suggest changes to existing ZCS guidelines for implementing TB activities in prisons from lessons learnt in delivering a model TB programme after 10 months of implementation.
- To advocate for improved conditions for inmates with TB in Zambia Correctional Service Facilities

Project location: Chingola, Mubwa, Shibuyunji Timelines: March 2023 – March 2024 Aim:

 To improve access to quality TB services in mining communities in Zambia through Community-led monitoring methods

- To raise awareness about TB and increase participation of affected communities in the monitoring of TB services in Chingola order to improve the accessibility, acceptability and quality of services and accountability by 2024

Timelines: November 2022-May 2024

**Overall Aim**: To contribute towards the TB elimination agenda in Zambia **Objectives**:

- To increase visibility and understanding of TB response and TB efforts at the country level.
- To conduct strong TB advocacy and create a critical mass to deliver change around TB issues.
- To enhance domestic resource mobilization and increase funding for TB
- To generate high-level advocacy activities targeting country key stakeholders and decision-makers.
- To ensure alignment of national and global advocacy efforts.
- To increase the number of partners engaged in TB response at the country level and ensure the relevance of the partnership platform.
- To position the country-level platforms as strategic leaders and key conveners and facilitators on TB.
- To increase the level of knowledge of key stakeholders at the country level on the overall budgetary needs to end TB at the country level, following a comprehensive approach and Global Plan to end TB 2023-2030.
- To create a roadmap towards increased budgetary contribution towards National TB programme activities.
- To increase domestic resources contributions towards the TB response.
- To secure statements and commitments from Ministers of Finance, Health and the Vice President on the need to fully fund TB response and identify approaches.
