

UNHLM TB 2018 Political Declaration para 53




53. Also request the Secretary-General, with the support of the World Health Organization, to provide a progress report in 2020 on global and national progress, across sectors, in accelerating efforts to achieve agreed tuberculosis goals within the context of achieving the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, including on the progress and implementation of the present declaration towards agreed tuberculosis goals at the national, regional and global levels, which will serve to inform preparations for a comprehensive review by Heads of State and Government at a high-level meeting in 2023.



Current situation

- WHO has developed Multisectoral Accountability Framework (MAF)
- Stop TB unpacked global UNHLM targets to indicative country targets
- Country partners work on sub-national targets for in-country accountability (e.g. India, Indonesia, Nigeria, Pakistan)
- African Union with Stop TB and WHO AFRO developed a TB score card for Heads of State and Government
- Most of the data needed for reporting are available –missing, e.g. children on MDR-TB treatment




National UNHLM Targets – Prevention, Treatment and Funding

UN Secretary-General Reports to the UNGA

HIV/AIDS Report (2019) – 27 pages

- Focus on regional and country progress against specific targets
- Emphasizes the importance of reaching vulnerable and marginalized groups and increasing funding
- Includes progress on joint AIDS/TB targets (e.g. integrated AIDS/TB counselling and treatment)

NCDs Report (2017) – 28 pages

- Focus on national level targets and action - 58% of countries have adopted national targets from NCDs UNHLM global targets
- Strong analysis of specific challenges to reaching targets and recommendations to address them
- Heavy on text and light on data

Summary Pursuant to General Assembly resolution 68/300, the present report sets out the progress achieved since 2014 in the implementation of the outcome document of the high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the comprehensive review and assessment of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases and of the political declaration of the high-level meeting of the Assembly on the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases, in preparation for a comprehensive review and assessment in 2018 of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases. In the report, it is underscored that action to realize the commitments made in 2011 and 2014 is inadequate, that the current level of progress is insufficient to meet target 3.4 of the Sustainable Development Goals on non-communicable diseases and that the world has yet to fulfil its promise of implementing measures to reduce the risk of dying prematurely from non-communicable diseases through prevention and treatment.	

NEXT STEPS

Working with WHO and all partners:

- Send the updated 2018 UNHLM indicative targets to Country Stakeholders
- Create Regional UNHLM Scorecards - (in progress) with Africa Union, all regions
- Tracking High-Level Commitments ('What Did you Do?' UNHLM Dashboards)
- Support the work for communities' monitoring/communities audit of TB response
- Support MAF variables development
- Beyond September - Unpack the UNSG 2020 Report for stakeholders and country level distribution

CHALLENGES

- Ensure and support participation in the report development of all constituencies
 - Civil society and affected community; Private sector; Research community; political leaders; parliamentarians
- Ideally (at least all HBCs) should hold an inclusive high level national review workshop
- Global consultation before the 2020 Report is finalized
- Availability and sources of data - missing data?
