


Priorities for the SDGs









Tuberculosis

- Cost
 - Latent TB screening
 - \$1,592 per TB found and treated (2.7m cases missing each year) = \$4.3bn
 - TB treatment drug sensitive
 - \$387 per person cured (5.8m cases) = \$2.2bn
 - TB treatment multi-drug resistant
 - \$3,228 per person cured (0.5m cases) = \$1.6bn
 - Total cost: \$8.1 billion annually or \$907 per TB person



Tuberculosis

- Benefit
 - 20 life years on average saved
 - \$1,000 or \$5,000 per DALY
 - 3% or 5% discount rate

Benefit per person	\$1,000	\$5,000
3%	\$14,877	\$74,387
5%	\$12,462	\$62,311

- Median benefit: \$38,594

- Cost \$907

Tuberculosis #1

- Tuberculosis killed 40,600 in 2016
- 60% go to private care, but get sub-standard treatment
- National Strategic Plan: engage with private providers
 - Subsidies for high-quality diagnostic tests
 - Free TB treatment for all those treated in the private sector
 - Adherence support to patients with linkage to a call centre
 - Provider support for notifying TB
- Average cost per year ₹15.2 crores (\$2m)
- Average benefit per year ₹2,721 crores (\$373m)
- Each rupee spent on TB will produce ₹171 of social good for Rajasthan

Bill Gates: The Best Investment I've Ever Made

Global health groups that buy and distribute medicines are a sure bet for saving lives, but their government funding is now in danger, and even the biggest philanthropies can't fill the gap

66 The Copenhagen Consensus Center is a think tank that uses sophisticated algorithms and the best available data to compare alternate povertyfighting strategies. Their tools have allowed us to test an interesting hypothesis: Suppose that our foundation hadn't invested in GAVI, the Global Fund and GPEI and had instead put that \$10 billion into the S&P 500, promising to give the balance to developing countries 18 years later. As of last week, those countries would have received about \$12 billion, adjusted for inflation, or \$17 billion if we factor in reinvested dividends.

What if we had invested \$10 billion in energy projects in the developing world? In that case, the return would have been \$150 billion. What about infrastructure? \$170 billion. By investing in global health institutions, however, we exceeded all of those returns: The \$10 billion that we gave to help provide vaccines, drugs, bed nets and other supplies in developing countries created an estimated \$200 billion in social and economic benefits.
